## ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN FOR SUPPORTING ACCESS TO FINANCE AND ENTERPRISE RECOVERY (SAFER) PROJECT

- 1. The Republic of Kenya (the Recipient) will implement the Supporting Access to Finance and Enterprise Recovery Project (SAFER) (P175017) (hereinafter, the **Project**), with the involvement of the National Treasury (NT) and Financial Intermediaries (FIs). The International Development Association (hereinafter the the Association) has agreed to provide financing for the Project.
- 2. The NT and relevant FI shall implement material measures and actions so that the Project is implemented in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs). This Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP) sets out material measures and actions, any specific documents or plans, as well as the timing for each of these.
- 3. The Recipient shall also comply with the provisions of any other Environmental and Social (E&S) Documents required under the ESF and referred to in this ESCP, including but not limited to the Environmental and Social Management System (ESMS), Stakeholder Engagement Plan (SEP), Labour Management Procedures (LMP), and the timelines specified in those E&S documents.
- 4. The Recipient is responsible for compliance with all requirements of the ESCP even when implementation of the specific measures and actions is conducted by NT, the Apex Project Implementating Entity (PIE), Participating Financial Institutions (PFIs), or other entities.
- 5. Implementation of the material measures and actions set out in this ESCP shall be monitored and reported to the Association by the Recipient as required by the ESCP and the conditions of the legal agreement, and the Association will monitor and assess progress and completion of the material measures and actions throughout implementation of the Project.
- 6. As agreed by the Association and the Recipient, this ESCP may be revised from time to time during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to assessment of Project performance conducted under the ESCP itself. In such circumstances, the Recipient will agree to the changes with the Association and will update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP will be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the Association and the Recipient. The Recipient shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
- 7. Where Project changes, unforeseen circumstances, or Project performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during Project implementation, Recipient shall provide additional funds, if needed, to implement actions and measures to address such risks and impacts, which may include risks and impacts on environment, community and occupational health and safety, gender based violence and labour conditions.
